Cash Bids

The new website now offers a mobile-friendly cash bids feature that has advanced, customizable views available through drop-down filters, visible on both your computer and phone.

To view, navigate to the full cash bids page on your site. A link to the bid page can be found on the home page. Next to the Futures column, in blue, click on 'View cash bids.' (Image 1).

Selecting Location and Commodity

Using the drop down menu, select your town name to get the latest bids for your area (Image 3).

Right under the location option, drop down the commodity that you would like to view (Image 4).




Default view shows all locations and all commodities, but you can easily customize your view. The component is set up to remember your last view on a device. It will show that same view the next time you access the cash bids page on that device.

DTN Weather

To view, navigate to the full weather page on your site. A link to the full weather page can be found on the home page. Under the **Weather** section, select **View full weather** (*Image 1*). There is also a link in the footer (*Image 2*) and/or in the main navigation, depending on how the site was built.



Enter your local zip code above the 5-day forecast widget to get customized weather for your area (Image 3).





Custom Maps

To access additional maps, click the "Layers" icon in the upper left corner of the top map (*Image 4*). The default map is Radar, but you can scroll through and click the check box next to any of the options listed to view the maps.
